
RHINO MAN

SYNOPSIS

In the midst of the battle to save the rhinos, a great ranger trainer, Martin Mthembu, has fallen, leaving a void in the fight. SOCIAL ISSUE

Despite the heroic efforts of anti-poaching rangers and conservation NGOs, rhinos are still being poached at a rate of 1-2 per day. One rhino horn can sell for up to \$200,000 USD on the black market, while unemployment near Kruger National Park soars above 30%. A lack of opportunities has created the conditions for crime syndicates to coerce desperate people into poaching rhinos for profit. At the current rate of poaching, all rhinos in the wild could become extinct in the next two decades.

Once the rhinos are gone, then it's elephants, it's lions
— with ecosystems being the interdependence of species, humans will soon be in line to go extinct.
